

### THE EASTERN TRAIL IS ON THE MOVE..... CLOSING THE GAPS, HEADED OVER THE RIVER AND THROUGH THE WOODS



#### Campaign status in a nutshell

Close the Gap: South Portland–Scarborough

- 1.6 miles, \$4.7 million project fully funded
- Final design and permitting completed
- Out for construction bid in June 2019
- Construction begins fall 2019, completed mid 2020
- Result: 16+ miles of connected off road trail connecting Bug Light in South Portland to Thornton Academy, Saco

Over the River: Saco-Biddeford

- 3.1 miles, requires feasibility study to determine costs
- Biddeford, Saco and ETMD plan to meet in 2019 with current operating rail corridor owner to explore rail-trail option - strong local support
- Result: 25+ miles through 7 communities
- Links ET segments between Saco and Biddeford
- Connects 16 miles N of Saco & 6 miles S of Biddeford

And...Through the Woods: Kennebunk–South Berwick

- 19 miles, \$170,00 raised as of April 2019
- \$100,000 funded survey, \$70,000 dedicated to design
- Requires feasibility study to determine total cost
- Letter of support received from corridor owner, Unitil
- 1st phase = 11 miles, survey & design from Kennebunk through Wells to Pratt & Whitney in North Berwick
- Embarking on major fundraising campaign, support from towns, major donors, local businesses, & grants
- Result: Phase 1 adds 11 miles, Phase 2 = 8 more miles

44 total off road miles when these campaigns are complete



#### A message from the ETMD Executive Director, Carole Brush

It seems like only yesterday that I connected with the Eastern Trail Alliance and Management District. It's hard to believe it's been twelve years. Time truly does fly when you're having fun!

At that time the Eastern Trail had 2 off-road sections for a total of 8 miles. Less than a decade later 3 new sections and 14 miles were added, resulting in 22 beautiful off-road miles of trail for people of all ages and abilities to enjoy. In 2020 we will have an additional 1.6 miles closing the critical gap between South Portland and Scarborough and be well on our way to designing and securing construction funding of the next sections.

None of this would have been possible without the vision, dedication and energy of our founder, John Andrews, and the support of each and every one of you. I am constantly awed and inspired by all the truly wonderful people I continue to meet who are so committed to our mission of completing this beautiful resource. I hope you will join me as we turn these 22 off-road miles into 44 and then 65!
