Board Approved:

• The Board decided at its last meeting to invite Alix Hopkins to share he experience and skills to help the ETMD strategies ways to build better grassroots support.

• Alix W. Hopkins has worked in land conservation for more than twenty years. During the 1990s she was founding executive director of Portland Trails, the urban land trust in Maine. She lives on an old farm in Pownal, Maine, and currently serves as co-president of the Pownal Land Trust and as a board member of the Maine Coast Heritage Trust, the Northern Forest Canoe Trail, and several other community-oriented nonprofits. Alix is the author of *Groundswell, Stories of Saving Places, Finding Community*. People long for a sense of community in today's fast-paced world, for connections to one another and to natural places of peace and beauty. Quietly, and for more than twenty years, a growing network of community trails, riverfront parks, forests, farms, gardens, and other green spaces has begun to satisfy this hunger, offering welcome refuges in neighborhoods, rural towns, and cities across the country.

• Alix presented a slide show depicting successful organizations and highlighted reasons for their success. She tailored the second half of her discussion to an evaluation of what has worked well for the ETA & ETMD and then what items she believed require more focus. See Attachment IV.B – Hopkins Handout.

• The Board held a discussion about what ETMD would need to move forward on some of Alix's recommendations.

C. Membership Fee & Member Attendance

1. Membership Fee

• The Board discussed the need for a maintenance reserve account to meet anticipated maintenance needs.

- Andrews suggested keeping the membership at \$5,000.
- Claus suggested having a voluntary \$1,000 fee to start a maintenance reserve account

• The Board discussed the merits of a two tiered membership fee (administrative fee with an optional maintenance fee). Consensus was there was some merit to the idea and that it would allow towns that wished to be more proactive to the successful operation of the ET to provide greater support until a better fee structure can be designed and implemented.

• Claus and Parker moved that the membership fee for the 07/08 year be maintained at \$5,000 with an additional request for a \$1,000 fee to fund a maintenance reserve account. **All Approved (8)**

2. Member Attendance

• The Board had a brief discussion on attendance and inviting the alternates to attend more regularly so that they are up-to-speed when required to serve in the director's absence. Hamblin will talk with Workman about drafting a letter from the Board about absenteeism.

ETA/ETMD Evaluation ~ December 13, 2006 Alix Hopkins (easy for me to say!)

Good things already happening at ETA/ETMD:

- A wonderful, clear idea to make a difference in the communities ET passes through and for residents in Southern Maine and beyond
- John Andrews
- Steve Workman, Bob Hamblen
- All the other good and consistent volunteers
- ETMD and town participation, most still involved
- Perseverance!!!
- * Visibility
- Good and consistent communications with members, both on paper and online

Things that need some work:

- Build on all your good work so far!
- Community engagement (broaden your reach way beyond the choir).
- Pro-active marketing & PR (it's a political campaign); raise \$ for a marketing campaign: look at the project with fresh eyes— see how others get excited, what draws them in.
- Hire staff: a serial collaborator with passion and energy to get the message out widely
- Broaden your board leadership: look for new people to infuse more energy, and with skills and perspectives complementary to those already in place.
- Tout economic development aspect as often as possible.
- Shift communications message to suggest a small, can-do organization. Show consistent progress, even if they are in small pieces.
- Keep eyes on small, achievable steps, not focused on how much money and how many more miles to go. That seems very daunting to someone looking from outside.
- Start planning NOW how to market the benefits of the trail so the 2007 bond will pass this time. Find a marketing person to help interpret your vision in new ways.
- Engage a marketing volunteer on your board or advisory group. List that advisory group so people will see that PEOPLE make the ET happen, and they will want to join in.
- Consider spearheading a collaborative arts project to inspire and engage a new group of supporters. Find someone to launch and run it for you.
- ETA has to survive its founders (look at Portland's new city council: engage younger people!).
- Use Northern Forest Canoe Trail (<u>www.northernforestcanoetrail.org</u>) as a model.

Key words to remember: Vision, Passion, Synchronicity, Innovation, Expansion, Persistence
